## Message *from the Superintendent*

June 30, 2007 marked the end of the one hundred seventieth year of continuous operation of the Ohio State School for the Blind. The school's goal of becoming the center of learning and resources for the visually impaired and blind students throughout the State of Ohio and the nation continues to be the main focus of the organization.

This year's class of fourteen graduating seniors has moved forward into a variety of settings when they returned to the community after graduation. One graduate will be attending a four-year college program, with financial assistance from the Board of Regents, and over forty thousand dollars in college scholarships, from various agencies, organizations, and support groups for blind and visually impaired students. One student was accepted and plans to attend a two-year college program in her community. Another student has enrolled in a specialized post-secondary training program and eleven students will take part in sheltered workshop programs in their community.

One hundred thirty-two students were enrolled in the school program during the 2006-2007 school year with 126 completing the school year. Of this group, fourteen students graduated, and four returned to their home school districts to continue their education at the local school district level.

OSSB is proud to report that during the 2006-2007 school year that the Center for Instructional Supports and Accessible Materials—CISAM, which is operated by the Ohio State School for the Blind provided services to 1,439 registered legally blind students in 363 school districts which requested Braille and large print materials for students. The school districts requested over 5,179 large print textbooks, 1,574 braille textbooks and over 2,956 instructional aides from the CISAM collection.

Again, the Ohio State School for the Blind Outreach Program and Services provided technical assistance, professional development, materials, and resources to families and local school districts serving children who are blind and visually impaired including those with multiple disabilities.

The staff of OSSB, through educational programs, educational assessments, consultations, residential services and summer programs has served over 1,824 students who are blind and visually impaired in the State of Ohio.

# History

The Ohio State School for the Blind was the first state-supported school for the blind in the United States, established with funds appropriated by the Ohio General Assembly.

The first school program, which was located in a private home in Columbus, opened its doors to five pupils and one teacher on July 4, 1837. The school was later moved to a facility located on Parsons Avenue, where it remained until 1953 when it was moved to its present site at 5220 North High Street, in Columbus, Ohio.

The school was assigned to the State Department of Education in 1927 with supervision of its operation under the leadership of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction.

During its many years of operation, the school has maintained a national reputation and leadership role among schools of its kind, and it continues today to provide the very best in educational programs for those blind and visually impaired children and youth enrolled.

# Mission

The Ohio State School for the Blind is dedicated to providing quality education to Ohio school-age children (5-21) whose visual impairment, even with correction, adversely affects educational performance.

Administrators and staff are committed to helping the OSSB student grow academically, physically, socially, and emotionally. Their overriding goal is to help students learn about overcoming handicaps and to help them excel in groups and as individuals.

# General Information

Placement at OSSB, recommended by the superintendent of the school district in which the student resides, is based upon information from a multifaceted assessment.

OSSB provides programs for preschool, school age, and multihandicapped visually impaired children. Prevocational, music, commercial arts, homemaking, and physical education offerings enhance a thorough academic program of studies.

The school provides a comprehensive program of services to the visually impaired children and youth enrolled, without cost to the parents. Room, board, laundry, general medical care, and educational materials are supplied. Arrangements are made between the parents and the local school districts for provision of transportation of the students to and from school on weekends and vacations. Parents are responsible for providing spending money, clothing, and major medical care.

The school is in session 36 weeks, from August to June. The school follows a typical school-year calendar with traditional holiday vacations. Students go home every weekend.

The operation of the Ohio State School for the Blind is primarily supported with appropriations from the General Assembly, and supplemental funds from a variety of federal sources.

The main building includes classrooms, gymnasium, cafeteria, auditorium, library, and student health services; a separate building nearby houses an indoor swimming pool.

The cottages on the school grounds are designed to accommodate a total of 128 students. Living arrangements include five cottage-style arranged, two group homes, and an honors apartment. Each cottage has a kitchen, lounge, and study area. Students are assigned to cottage rooms of two, three, and four persons on the basis of age and sex. Housing is provided for all students who cannot be transported on a daily basis.


