**Job Duties:** Provides academic and behavior modification instruction by: Operating the In-School Suspension/Time-Out Center (e.g., conducting behavior management lessons regarding the student's rule infraction and alternative choices); preparing and updating curriculum of behavior management; and serving at Time-Out Center when needed. Maintains communication by: collaborating with students and teachers (e.g., completing of behavior consequences; transitioning back to the classroom); corresponding regularly with student's teachers regarding their academic progress and assigned work; keeping appropriate parties (e.g., academic, student life, student support services, etc.) informed of student's conduct and placement within ISS/AEP; reviewing regularly behavior data information and presenting findings to the principal. maintaining records by: preparing written records regarding student's progress preparing and updating curriculum (e.g., behavior management alternatives and consequences, student attendance, etc.). works with the Student Life Department and other service agencies by: coordinating services and programming with AIM; meeting regularly with staff to discuss student discipline; coordinating and supervising community service activities for ISS and AEP students.

#### Minimum Qualifications

Must possess B.A. /B.S. Degree in Education of the Deaf. Must maintain valid Ohio teaching certification and/or licensure. Must maintain valid ODE van certification for transportation of students for work experience. Must demonstrate advance level of ASL on SLPI rating. Must demonstrate the ability to communicate effectively with students, parents, and other staff members by using American Sign Language (ASL), written English, and electronic communication systems.

**Conditions for Employment:** Employment is contingent upon successful completion of criminal background check. The final applicant for this position will be required to submit to urinalysis prior to appointment to test for illegal drug use. An applicant with a positive test result will not be offered employment. Unless otherwise instructed, submit a separate application or resume for each job opportunity posting in which you are interested. Enter the classification and position number (PN) of the position for which you are applying at the top of the front page of the application. You must demonstrate on your application how you meet the minimum qualifications for this position.
