After School Care Snack Program

The After School Care Snack Program (ASCSP) is a federal reimbursement program established by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA). The program provides reimbursement to schools such as OSSB in an effort to help us serve nutritious snacks to students after their school day ends. The program provides a nutritional boost and encourages participation in supervised activities that are safe, fun and filled with learning opportunities.

At OSSB we encourage our students and staff to be health conscious and offer healthier meals and snacks which contain more fruits, vegetables <u>and</u> whole grains.

The USDA has provided a nutritional guideline for the program and those are provided on the following pages.
