

PURPOSE

The Ohio State School for the Blind, is offering a one week camp for students who are blind or visually impaired and who will be entering the 4th – 7th grades in fall 2009. The goals of this camp will be to:

- Provide experiences for the continuing development of daily living skills with an emphasis on food preparation and nutrition.
- Encourage young students who are blind or visually impaired to learn to lead an active life by providing a variety of leisure activities in the area of table games, arts and crafts, music, and movement.
- Simulate a camp experience in a safe, fun environment.
- Provide an opportunity for the participants to meet and make friends with peers across the state.
- Provide a variety of experiences for the students to socially interact appropriately with peers by participating in active as well as quiet games.
- Encourage students to be independent by keeping themselves busy with making things and being active when they return home, as well as to develop lifelong skills that encourage community participation.

WHO MAY ATTEND?

Ohio students who are blind or visually impaired, in the 4th through 7th grades, and who demonstrate independent living skills appropriate to their age, may attend the Daily Living Skills, Leisure and Recreation Camp. This year, there is a camp fee of \$75.00 to cover room and board.

TRANSPORTATION

Parents must provide transportation for the students to OSSB between 4:00 P.M. and 6:00 P.M. on Sunday, June 21, 2009, the evening before camp begins. There will be pizza and pop for the campers served in the cottages Sunday

evening. Students must be transported home on Friday, June 26, 2009, at 1:00 P.M.
